- Respect in full the principles of non-discrimination and to promote and ensure equal access and opportunities to mobile participants from all backgrounds, in particular disadvantaged or vulnerable groups.
- Apply a selection process that is fair, transparent and documented, ensuring equal opportunities to participants eligible for mobility.
- Ensure recognition for satisfactorily completed activities of study mobility and, where possible, traineeships of its mobile students.
- Charge no fees, in the case of credit mobility, to incoming students for tuition, registration, examinations or access to laboratory and library facilities. Nevertheless, they may be charged small fees on the same basis as local students for costs such as insurance, student unions and the use of miscellaneous material.

The higher education institution located in a **Partner Country** of Erasmus+ further undertakes to:

Before mobility

- Provide information on courses (content, level, scope, language) well in advance of the mobility periods, so as to be transparent to all parties and allow mobile students to make well-informed choices about the courses they will follow.
- Ensure that outbound mobile participants are well prepared for the mobility, including having attained the necessary level of linguistic proficiency.
- Ensure that student and staff mobility for education or training purposes is based on a learning agreement for students and a mobility agreement for staff validated in advance between the sending and receiving institutions or enterprises and the mobile participants.
- Provide assistance related to obtaining visas, when required, for incoming and outbound mobile participants. Costs for visas can be covered with the mobility grants. See the information / visa section for contact details.
- Provide assistance related to obtaining insurance, when required, for incoming and outbound mobile participants. The institution from the Partner Country should inform mobile participants of cases in which insurance cover is not automatically provided. - Provide guidance to incoming mobile participants in finding accommodation. See the information / housing section for contact details.

During and after mobility

- Ensure equal academic treatment and services for home students and staff and incoming mobile participants and integrate incoming mobile participants into the institution's everyday life, and have in place appropriate mentoring and support arrangements for mobile participants as well as appropriate linguistic support to incoming mobile participants.
- Accept all activities indicated in the learning agreement as counting towards the degree, provided these have been satisfactorily completed by the mobile student.
- Provide, free-of-charge, incoming mobile students and their sending institutions with transcripts in English or in the language of the sending institution containing a full, accurate and timely record of their achievements at the end of their mobility period.
- Support the reintegration of mobile participants and give them the opportunity, upon return, to build on their experiences for the benefit of the Institution and their peers.
- Ensure that staff are given recognition for their teaching and training activities undertaken during the mobility period, based on a mobility agreement.

Roles of higher education institutions within this inter-institutional Erasmus+ agreement:

- ✓ Constantine the Philosopher University in Nitra (SK NITRA01):

Role: project coordinator in charge of applying for the KA107 mobility project, signing and managing the grant agreement, administering Erasmus+ bilateral agreements, managing the mobility flows, financing and reporting the mobilities and spending of Erasmus+ financial means toward the National Erasmus+ Agency in Slovakia. When sending participants, it is also in charge of selecting students and sending them abroad, preparation, monitoring and recognition related to the mobility period. When receiving participants, it is also in charge of receiving students/staff from abroad for study and/or teaching, providing them counselling and tutoring in study issues and providing support in managing housing, visa and insurance for the incoming participants within the receiving country.

- ✓ Ukrainian Engineering Pedagogics Academy, Kharkiv:

Role: partner for communication and managing the mobility flows. When sending participants, it is also in charge of selecting students and sending them abroad, preparation, monitoring and recognition related to the mobility period. When receiving participants, it is also in charge of receiving students/staff from abroad for study and/or teaching and for providing support in managing housing, visa and insurance for the incoming participants within the receiving country.

Constantine the Philosopher University in Nitra established specialised Centre for support of study of disabled students in 2012/2013. For students from Partner Countries, the first criterion for selecting students will be academic merit, but with equivalent academic level. Along with this criteria, sending institution should take into consideration student's language competence. Furthermore, it may apply another criteria, e.g., student's achievements in representing the home institution, his/her extra-curricular activities, etc.

Lower priority will be given to those students who have already participated in mobility actions in the same study cycle under the Lifelong Learning Programme/Erasmus Programme, Erasmus Mundus Programme or the Erasmus+ Programme.

International Erasmus+ student coming to UKF in Nitra is asked to earn at least 20 ECTS per semester or mobility (or 40 ECTS for the full academic year, i.e. for 2 semesters).

Ukrainian Engineering Pedagogics Academy:

1. Incoming exchange students are required to agree on the duration and kind of studies (study courses or project work) with the contact person prior arrival at UEPA.
2. UEPA could welcome students and staff with disabilities, only according to prior approval of each separate case.

SK NITRA01: All incoming students must be nominated by their home institution yet before the deadline. All documents of incoming students and staff have to be sent to the International Relations and Mobility Office of Constantine the Philosopher University in Nitra.

Ukrainian Engineering Pedagogics Academy, Kharkiv: All incoming students must be nominated by their home institution yet before the deadline. All documents of incoming students and staff have to be sent to the Training and Scientific Center for Innovative Educational Technologies and Academic Mobility (International Relations Department), Ukrainian Engineering Pedagogics Academy.

2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 4 weeks.
3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 4 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. *[It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]*
4. Termination of the agreement

[It is up to the involved institutions to agree on the procedure for modifying or terminating the inter-institutional agreement. However, in the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."]

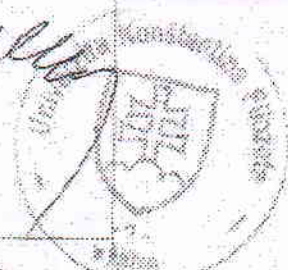
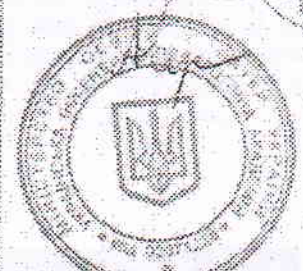
